#### FOURTH WEEK OF LENT

A woman caught in adultery testifies how Jesus halted her execution.

#### FIFTH WEEK OF LENT

John speaks to the accusation of consuming Jesus' body and blood.

#### PALM SUNDAY

Mary Magdalene is a witness to Jesus' activities, especially his last week.

#### EASTER SUNDAY

Mary Magdalene shocks people with news that Christ has risen from the dead.

Yes, the financial numbers you have been seeing in the Sunday bulletins are correct. At the end of November, we had a deficit of \$2,800 comparing income and expenses, and we had already added \$15,000 from our savings to help the income. #### Your Endowment Fund - Gifts and Benefits

Year-end gifts of \$2525, added to other gifts during 2006, provided a total increment of \$3975 to the Endowment Fund. These gifts raised the principal to a new high of \$68,382 as of December 31, 2006.

Annual interest in 2006 of \$1300 from the Endowment Fund will be used to provide \$800 toward a new leadership/ministry program, and \$500 to missions, extending a special interest of **Romaine Richwine**, provided for by a bequest of her husband, **Rolland**, in 2004.



An exciting new *lifetime gift* alternative to the more common bequest - the Charitable Gift Annuity - has appeared on the scene for persons age 60 or older. The Annuity calls for an irrevocable gift of \$10,000 or more, best with appreciated securities such as stocks, insurance, property, etc. One of our senior couples is now deriving the benefit of such a gift in terms of higher income and greater tax advantages for life. until February 28. Here's a chance to reach out to some most unfortunate men, women, and children with your donations and with your prayers.

This trip will reach out to the Dalits living in rural villages in North India. Dalits are the "outcasts" of Indian society — the "untouchables," comprising 1/4 of the total population of India — a massive 250-300 million people. Most make less than a dollar a day and cannot afford food, clothing, and shelter.

This team of doctors and nurses will stay in hotels at night and travel about 30

minutes into the villages each day, treating patients with a variety of illnesses. Many will have colds and flu. About 10% will be treated for trauma, old and new; 10% will have more complicated diseases like PID, diabetes, neurological disorders, HIV;15 % will have diseases common to India like leprosy, tuberculosis, malaria.

National physicians — who have a handle on local outbreaks, customs, and will do follow-up care — will work with the team to provide care.

Please keep Betty and this mission team in your prayers March 10-24.

## Worship Leader Minute for February

A group of seminary students asked their theology professor Worship which translation of the Bible he preferred, *The Message*, *King* Leader James, New Revised Standard or which? The professor thought for a

moment and then he answered, I prefer my mother's translation. The students were perplexed. Which translation was your mother a part of? they asked. He replied simply, *She translated the Bible every single day...into her life.* 

As Christians we can say the right words, use the right phrases, quote the scriptures, but if we don't integrate those words into our everyday lives they mean nothing. One of my memories from childhood is adults around me saying, Do as I say, not as I do. I am sure that many of you have heard the same thing! Did it make a difference? Not really. We modeled their behavior. We pretended to do what they did. We played dress up to look like them, we tried to talk like them, and we mimicked their attitudes and comments. The example our parents, our grandparents, our other family members and friends set is what really made the difference to us, and to our choices. If we want people who come to our church to "try it out" or the people that we encounter everyday in everything that we do to see Jesus Christ, then we need to take the words that we read in the Bible, and that we hear on a Sunday morning, and put them into practice in all things that we do. The message is important, but our actions carry the meaning of the message.

I have spent a lot of time writing about worship, and what it is and what it means to us as individuals. I am going to shift my focus this year and look at how we take our worship and move it out to the world. The Great Commission tells us to go and make disciples. Let's do that together!

Question to ponder: How do I show others that I believe in Jesus Christ?


