### From the Pastor's Desk

From Pastor Jerry McGrath

here have been many comments about the vision and direction of Lincoln Park Community United Methodist Church. Many have commented on leadership and terms like coaching, equipping, and empowering. What is the role of staff in leadership? Shouldn't the pastor be making all the decisions? As I have been wrestling with the direction and leadership of the church, I came across a great article about Words at a Service of Ordination spoken by the Rev. Don Meir. This article was a God-Send, and I want to share part of it with you.

Meir gives words of wisdom to pastors and leaders taking on leadership roles in churches for the first time. He first mentions the trap of ministers taking on too much responsibility and church members letting them off the hook. A pastor or church leader's job is to equip others to be ministers too. not just as helpers in the church but in what people do in their lives and work. Rather than do all the official praying for the church, pastors and leaders need to invite others to practice the art of public and spontaneous prayer. Rather than assuming all pastoral care is part of pastoral authority, pastors and leaders need

to let the laity develop the ministry of caring for one another. When we fall into the trap of letting people call the pastor, "minister," the priesthood of all believers is diminished.

Another trap to avoid in pastoral leadership is letting what happens within the four walls consume the ministry of the church. Ministry is what happens when

> our members leave the church on Sunday. The job of the pastors and leaders is to support the laity, validate them, and hold them accountable to Gospel values.

Lastly, Meir warns of the final trap for pastors and leaders to avoid. *Do not let your leadership become dominating*. THE BEST

PASTORS AND LEADERS ARE SER-VANTS, NOT AUTOCRATS. How many times do we see churches revolve around pastors and leaders rather than the needs and issues of the community? Pastors and leaders of the church are not magistrates. The job of pastors and leaders is not to build themselves up, but to build up others, so that the work of Christ can increase. The staff of Lincoln Park Community United Methodist Church are called to be spiritual leaders, serving, empowering, and equipping the laity and guiding the laity in the ministry of their daily lives.



### JUNE 1 - RAIN DATE FOR HIKE or PICNIC AT TRACY'S HOUSE


