

# THINKING ABOUT THE BUDGET?

Are you thinking about the 2009 church budget? Probably not, but it is time to start. Yes, everyone, not just committee members.

Even though 2008 is three quarters over, it is time to start building the 2009 Budget.

The normal process is that the committees (Education, Missions, Nurture and Witness, Stewardship, Worship, Staff Parish, and Trustees) and the church staff look at what they have spent in previous years and figure they will need a little more for 2009, and submit a budget request. After the fall stewardship campaign, the Finance Committee will predict the amount of money available for 2009. A give and take balance is reached, and then a final 2009 Budget is approved at a Church Council meeting.

This year we need to be different. Why? This year we need to include some things that have not been in the budget before and perhaps eliminate some of the old items. Fund-raisers need to be changed or, hopefully, the need for them eliminated. The budget needs to be all inclusive except for an unforeseen emergency. All of this in the present economic climate - WOW!

In conversing with members through the past several years, some issues have been raised. Some members from the contempo-

rary service state that since that service was formed, they have had little or no budgeted money and any money they wanted to spend, they had to raise for themselves. Some members from the traditional service complain that the old fund raisers (flea market and autumn auction) were to help the budget, but the new fund-raisers are to help only the contemporary service. Can we solve all this by making sure everything is in the budget and having all fund-raisers support the all inclusive budget?

A few members have on occasion complained about where the committees have spent their budgeted money. Now, you have the chance to help form the 2009 budget by talking with members on those committees. If you are not sure who to contact, see or call me, **Jerry Manhart**, and I will make sure your ideas are considered

Have you heard anyone state that because of the economy we will not have enough money to support the budget? It is impossible to predict what everyone else will pledge to give; you can only control your own giving. If you are able to give 10% of your income, as the bible suggests, then we must have faith that when put with the giving of others it will prove to be enough to cover our budgeted expenses.

This Fall's schedule for children will include sessions for PRESCHOOLERS (3, 4 & 5 YEAR OLDS) THROUGH EARLY ELEMENTARY (GRADES 1-4) at 9:15 am after Children's Time at Contemporary Worship. Tricia Pence is scheduling leaders for these multi-age sessions which will use Cokesbury's United Methodist curriculum, Live B.I.G.---Hear, See and Live Your Belief In God!

The first ADULT option for Sunday mornings will be the Lectionary Class

Bible Study in the Church Library, 10-10:45 am for those interested in a broad overview and discussion of key Bible stories and events. Adults able to give a hand with leading this class are encouraged to contact **Norm Dettra**.

Christian Education for all ages continues from **10:20-11:05** am with classes throughout LP's facilities.

- PRESCHOOLERS THROUGH 6TH GRADERS will use Cokesbury's *Rock Solid:*Building A Heart of Faith. Both Live B.I.G. and Rock Solid begin with "In The Beginning: The Stories of Creation." Each week the children will encounter a Bible story and will be helped to experience and understand the Scripture to apply it to their daily lives. Children will meet in Rms 101, 102 & 104
- THE YOUTH CLASS, 7-12 GRADERS, will be using United Methodist resources, 3V Bible Studies for youth and will meet in the Youth Room. The fall series, *Extraordinary New Testament People*, asks how someone goes from ordinary to extraordinary. The answer centers on Jesus and this is what **Cori Pasquale**, Youth Team Leader, and her teaching team will explore as they look at the biblical text itself, then add the background of the social and cultural con-

Inner Mongolia and the Silk Roads form a giant northwesterly arc linking Siberia with Central Asia, comprising about one third of the region of China. Forests, sandy deserts and grasslands cover the area, and include some of the highest mountains in the world.

As an Autonomous Region, they have a type of self-government, as well as guarded freedom to practice various forms of religion.

vices Exchange. They are politically accepted in the area.

I will leave from Harrisburg on October 10, and travel to Detroit to meet the team of 20. Our team includes doctors, dentists, technicians, nurses, pharmacists and non-medical persons. The team will fly to Narita, Japan, then on to Bejing. From there we will board a train for the 23 hour trip to Zalantan, Inner Mongolia. From this moderate size city we will travel daily to nearby areas to set up clinics. With the aid of interpreters, we will provide free medical care and medicine.

As on previous trips, I will take adult and children's vitamins with iron and basic tablet form of Ibuprofen. Liquid vitamins for infants are also accepted. Please—no gel-caps or other forms of Ibuprofen. There is a box in the Wagner Room for the collection of medicines between now and September 13.

Your prayer support is vital to the success of any outreach for the Lord's work. On behalf of the team and myself, I ask for your prayer support now through the end of October for a successful outreach to those in need, for openness of the Chinese, and for safety and good health for the team.

Thank you for your prayers, your encouragement and your support.
