SHARING IN A MISSION PROJECT WITH A SISTER CHURCH

Our combined service at 10 am, Sunday, March 29, will emphasize mission work in our UM Church outside our community. Although there's been a shift in our emphasis at Lincoln Park to use our Missions Designated Funds for local ministries, we did respond to our sister church in Mohnton.

The people of Calvary UM Church have reached out to us and many other local churches to join them in an exciting ministry in India - the Good Shepherd Mission. Over the past 10 years they've been involved in helping to establish a ministry which includes an orphanage, medical and dental clinics, a hospital, and evangelistic outreach to Indian communities.

A challenge presented is:

Question: How do you provide quality medical care for 5 million poor people living in and around the vil-

lage of Puttur, India?

• Answer: Take the next step with us.

The challenge for Calvary is to create an endowment fund of \$1,000,000 to generate an annual operating budget (of about \$50,000) for the hospital. Involved folks from Calvary will share details of

their mission with us. We'll be asked as individuals to contribute if so moved.

As Christians trying to minister, we know that there's more need in the world than any of us can meet with our limited resources. If we help one, we're still

From the Pastor's Desk

From Pastor Jerry McGrath

When Moses went up on the mountain, the cloud covered it, and the glory of the Lord settled on Mt. Sinai. For six days the cloud covered the mountain, and on the seventh day the Lord called to Moses from within the cloud...Then Moses entered the cloud... and he stayed on the mountain forty days and forty nights. Exodus 24:15-18

his scripture passage comes to remind us as we enter the season of Lent, how important it is to wait upon God with an attitude of expec-

tation. Can you imagine what it must have been like for Moses to wait six days, all by himself, for God to finally talk! We can barely wait 30 seconds for God to speak, before we start filling in the quiet.

for that time?

After Moses finally hears from God, he has to stay and listen for another 40 days. We can hardly stand to sit still on Sunday mornings for more than 60 minutes, let alone more than a month! Think of what we might be missing in the real world that whole time! Could our place of employment possibly continue without us

Forty days is a long time, and a lot can happen. But this passage helps put everything into perspective...God's perspective. Nothing holy happens in any length of time without first ap-

proaching God. We aren't expected to go onto a seculded mountain for the 40 days of Lent...but we are expected to turn to God, and wait expectantly for God to speak to us, in every one of those 40 days of Lent... and every other day of our life.

I would urge you to make special efforts to worship with your church family

every Sunday during Lent. I also would encourage you to take advantage this Lenten season of our Sunday night study, *Alive at Five*, at 5 pm. Our Lenten time of worship, prayer, and study is to us as Moses' time on the mountain was to him. We cannot feel the complete presence of God in isolation from the rest of the family.



- → Audit Committee members needed to conduct annual audit (careful analysis of financial records, procedures and policies) for 2008 budget.


