He is not here; for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.

Matthew 28: 6

was the first day of the week at early dawn. There were few who cared to remember the gruesome crucifixion of the preceding Friday. A troublesome dis-

senter was dead and buried in a tomb ordered sealed by Pilate, and everybody was eager to get on with business as usual.

Pilate, the Pharisees, and the Roman soldiers were shocked and bewildered to discover that it took more than a cross to stop the Master. They were both angered and dismayed when the

whisper, *He has risen*, swept like a gentle wind across Jerusalem. The whole story sounded absurd to the realists, and they scoffed at it.

Even the disciples first treated the resurrection story as "an idle tale,"


according to Luke. But it wasn't "an idle tale." It was true. The living spirit of Jesus was abroad again in the world. It touched the disciples in their discouragement and sent them to "turn

the world upside down" with their message and their faith. It caught the imagination of disillusioned followers who flung their faith around the world.

Nothing can stop the spirit of truth and love living in human personality. *He has risen*, and his spirit goes on marching through the world, making conquerors uneasy and autocratic crowns insecure. He speaks in the towns of

North Korea, in the villages of Iraq, and he can't be silenced. He touches life in the huts of China and apartments of Chicago and New York City. Through all the ages His message marches on.

Let's Talk about Books

Pastor Dorris McCoy recently suggested that we share our thoughts in the

News-Linc about books we've read. OK, I'll go first ... in the hopes that you'll also comment on this book or send us your review of a book that's touched you.

My daughter-in-law suggested I read *The Shack*, by William Paul Young. We both like suspense, and she knows I'm interested in spiritual things.

The Shack is a book about grief of the worst kind: the brutal loss of a child. Mackenzie Philips's youngest daughter is abducted and murdered in an abandoned shack in the wilderness. Four years later, Mack receives a note from God inviting him to that same shack.

God, the Holy Spirit, and Jesus Christ turn out to be different from Mack's -- and most readers' -- expectations. Through the course of the novel, Mack is healed from his dark despair by this surprising, miraculous encounter.

The book challenges the reader to think of God's plan and place in human suffering. "It's actually the bad things in life that move us forward," one reader said. Some say they've been forever

changed by it. "God knows where we hurt," says Young, "and he has a great affection for us."

I was most interested to see Young on morning TV not long ago. The story of how he came to write and publish

The Shack seemed miraculous to me. His wife encouraged him to write this book for his six children (ages 15-28). She felt he had a unique vision of faith that should be passed on. So he wrote it and made 15 copies at Office Depot. From this beginning, *The Shack* has sold over 61 million copies.

I sometimes found the book and its premise to be a little "hokey," almost contrived, but it certainly gets a person thinking about God and faith in a positive way. Young says, "How would things change if God actually cared about us and was involved in our daily lives?"

Isn't this the essence of faith? Wouldn't this be the most awesome, most heavenly way to live?
