Endowment Fund Exceeds \$100,000

During the summer, gifts to the glory of God in honor and memory of **Barbara Starr**, along with several single gifts, have empowered the Endowment Fund to a total of \$100,043, providing greater future support of program and physical improvements beyond our operating budget.

In addition, the fund is assured of the proceeds of a \$10,000 irrevocable Charitable Gift Annuity, arranged by a member couple, with immediate tax benefit and annual income while deriving satisfaction from their legacy to God's church in Lincoln Park. Three bequests have also been confidentially disclosed.

The Endowment Fund started with a \$2,000 estate settlement gift in 1982, and has grown steadily over the years, exceeding \$100,000 today. The Endowment Fund Committee wishes to thank once again the numerous members, staff, and friends of the church who have made contributions -- large and small -- over 27 years of the fund's existence

Sam Gundy: Naturalist, Educator, Museum Director, War Hero, Loving Husband

Lincoln Park's **Sam Gundy** was recently called "Berks County's most knowledgeable naturalist," by Bill Ulrich in the *Reading Eagle* (August 17).

Sam was recognized recently by Hawk Mountain officials for his "lifetime commitment to conservation causes."

A boyhood interest in the natural world led Sam to work his way through Kutztown State Teachers College where he studied the biological sciences that were so interesting to him. His education was interrupted by World War II, but he completed it on his return and became first an enthusiastic teacher in the Reading School District, then Director of the Reading Public Museum, and, finally, Professor at Kutztown University.

At 91, Sam Gundy has had a remarkable life, including his service in the US Army Air Force, flying 18 missions in Europe, the last ending when his plane was hit and exploded. Sam parachuted to the ground and was captured by German soldiers. Seriously injured, he was hospitalized and then incarcerated for

over a year.

A thoughtful, well-written account of Sam's life experiences was written for the spring 2008 issue of the *Historical Review of Berks County*, by Barry L. Kauffman, from which much of this information is gleaned.

Determination, courage, thirst for knowledge, and love of his country and wife **Mary** seem to be the hallmarks of Sam's life. Mary and Sam met in 1940 when Mary, a Phys Ed Major at West Chester State Teachers College, worked as a playground leader for the Reading Recreation Department. Sam was the Nature Director and would bring all kinds of animals -- snakes, raccoons -- to the playgrounds for "show and tell."

Mary "grew as fond of the young naturalist as she did of his snakes and things." says Kauffman. The Gundys were married September 30, 1943, before Sam left for combat. Today they have two children, four grandchildren, and two greatgrandchildren.

It's quite a story! If you'd like to read Kauffman's account -- Lt. Samuel C. Gundy, Patriotism, Passion, and Perseverance: A Hero's Story -- I will leave a couple copies in my mailbox in the Church Office


