The program takes place **Saturday**, **January 23**, from 9 am-noon, in Memorial Hall. Mark your calendars now and learn what's in store for the Body of





Now I have blocked out time properly, for God and my family.


As we approach a new year with new ministries, let us remember to put God first in all our planning. Let us have a healthy, safe, and significant new year in the name of Jesus.
