
Autumn Auction Gears Up

fter camping for three weeks in Alaska, my brother, sister-in-law, and I opted for a little luxury on a cruise ship for seven days. Shortly after boarding, we were required to attend a safety drill that I thought was an inconvenient waste of time.

That night after our set-sail party, luxurious dinner, and live entertainment, we weary passengers fell into bed, dreaming of exquisite scenery about to enchant us at Glacier Bay. At 4 am, we were stunned into consciousness by the loudest horn I'd ever heard. The captain shouted from the loud speaker, "Ladies and gentlemen, get dressed immediately and report to your lifeboat muster station! We fear someone has been pushed or fallen overboard, and we are required by law to retreat back to that spot."

In a daze, we pulled jeans over our pajamas, grabbed our jackets, and stumbled to our muster station where we stood outside in the freezing cold while the crew called the names of all 2,000 passengers. Thankfully, everyone was present. False alarm. The captain told us he'd never had to summon passengers from their beds in his 23 years on the seas.

As we stood there shivering, I remembered how I'd complained in the past about having to wear a seat belt or life jacket. I'd even complained about the commandment to keep holy the Lord's day. That night I decided safety devices are gifts as amazing as having God in my life. Someone smarter than me knows better than me.

Lord, help me to be thankful, not resentful, when asked to buckle up, wear the life jacket, helmet, harness; hold on to the hand rail; or attend church services every Sunday.

Thinking Out Loud

Where your treasure is, there will you heart be also. – Luke 12:34

Creation itself is

rightly understood."

Preparing for this year's annual stewardship program, I've come to better understand that STEWARDSHIP — the careful management of God's economy — ultimately "turns on affection," in the words of farmer, novelist, and poet Wendell Berry.

"It is from this shared life and place that the stewarding of In Luke's Gospel, Jesus warns the multitude against greed. He tells the parable of a rich man whose land produced a bountiful crop. With no place to store the harvest, he builds more barns to store his grain and goods, say-

ing, "Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink and be merry." But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God.

In his Jefferson Lecture in the Humanities in 2012, Berry quoted his teacher Wallace Stegner, stating that Americans are divided into two kinds. There are Boomers and there are Stick-

ers. Boomers "pillage and run," while Stickers "settle and love the life they have made and the place they have made it in." While the rich man did not exactly "pillage and run" like modern corporate raiders, I think both are Boomers. Their

> lives revolve around themselves and what they can accumulate.

I believe the biblical testimony is clear. God calls us to be Stickers. There is a quality of life, an understanding, a knowing, that only comes to those who nurture an awareness

and affection for "the life they have made and the place they have made it in." For me, this life and place includes the local church: those who worship, pray, and serve together. It is from this shared life and place that the stewarding of Creation itself is rightly understood. When you love someone or something more than yourself, you're willing to make the sacrifices necessary to leave that person or community of faith better off than when you found them.

Berry is right, it does all "turn on affection."
