

Greetings to you in our Lord's name! So much could be said about this time of the year.

On November 3, we'll remember some of our saints who have gone to be with the Lord. We pray for God's continued comfort and peace for those mourning the loss of a family member or friend during this season.

Every November, we honor National Hunger & Homelessness
Awareness Week before Thanksgiv-

ing. It's a time for thinking about what we're thankful for, as well as for sharing compassion with our homeless neighbors and for working toward a world where no one has to experience hunger and homelessness.

On December1, the first Sunday of Advent, we begin a season of preparation for celebrating the birth of Christ. I hope in the midst of preparing, we try to keep the main thing the main thing because *Jesus is the reason for the season*.

In January 2020, we begin our Platinum Jubilee year: It will be 75 years

since the founding of Lincoln Park United Methodist Church. We are planning for a whole year of celebrations. On page 6, you can read about some of our plans for the coming year.

#### Operation Christmas Child - The Power of a Simple Gift

Shoeboxes Since 2002, generous participants at our church have filled nearly 1000 boxes with small gifts for children, many of whom have never before received a gift. Check in the Wagner Room for brochures explaining the ministry, suggested gifts, and instructions for preparing the box. WE HAVE SHOE BOXES FROM SA-MARITAN'S PURSE THAT MAY BE USED TO PACK GIFTS (you'll have to fold one yourself!). Note that you may use a shoe box or a plastic container like a shoe box.

This ministry not only provides smiles and gifts, but reading materials and follow-up (by Samaritan's Purse ministry founded by Franklin Graham, son of Billy) to introduce children to Jesus Christ - in over 130 countries. Over 168 mil-

lion boxes have been distributed over the years by this ministry. An online feature allows you to trace where your box goes. Boxes are due in the Wagner Room by Sunday November 24.

## Salvation Army Adopt-A-Family Angel Tree

A *Platinum Jubilee* is in the works to celebrate 75 years in the life of LPCUMC. Pastor Chris has "prayerfully considered" this milestone and come up with meaningful ways to mark this event throughout 2020. Already, a Jubilee Committee is being formed, and you're invited to be part of it.

Here are some of his suggestions:

#### HONOR OUR HISTORY

- Invite former Pastors to speak on given Sundays in 2020, and to be present on Anniversary Sunday in September.
- Create an archives display for Jubilee events, and a permanent one in our buildings. (including portraits of former Pastors)
- Create recordings of our seniors sharing memories and experiences, to be played through 2020 on Sundays and coffee hours.
- Create a commemorative book (with ads to support costs and a special endowment fund for mission outreach.)
- Take a picture of our whole congregation on Anniversary Sunday.

#### PLAN EVENTS AND CELEBRATIONS

• A Platinum Jubilee concert

- A banquet to benefit a new scholarship fund.
- A special, free meal for the community
- A spiritual journey with youth and others to the Taize

Community, France

• An evangelism training event for our church and others (through a DeWees grant.)

#### **OUTREACH AND INITIATIVES**

- Fund the drilling of 10 or more wells in world villages without running water.
- Create an endowment to provide scholarships for two students from area high schools who will attend RACC or Albright, and scholarships to our own youth pursuing higher education.
- Establish a prison ministry team to visit inmates and others just released.
- Establish four service awards for volunteerism, to be announced on Anniversary Sunday annually.
- Find a special way to bless shut-ins through the year and begin a food ministry for those who've been hospitalized and returned home.

May this Jubilee Anniversary of our beloved church spark a bonfire of good fellowship and good works in the world!

#### **Keeping Us Safe at Lincoln Park Church**

To prepare and plan for the possible (but hopefully unlikely) threat of an aggressive intruder or active shooter event at LPCUMC, we will proactively offer an instructorled class known as ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate.)

The training is in two parts. First, each person taking the training must pass the elearning class *before* the hands-on training. The online class cost is \$30 per person. If you desire, the church will reimburse the cost. To begin,

Next click on the red box *Houses of Worship*.

Then click on *Congregants (Individuals & Families)* and order e-learning. After completing the computer-based training, you must print and provide a copy of your certification to the instructor at the hands-on training. This second, hands-on, part of the training will be taught by **the Rev. Mark Beideman**, Certified ALICE Trainer. It will be held after church on **Sunday**, **November 17**, at 1 pm. Lunch will be provided, and the training should last about three hours.

Training as many congregants as possible – and not just our leaders – is paramount. In the event of a shooting incident, the more trained people the better.

<sup>6</sup> What I mean is this: the one who sows a small number of seeds will also reap a small crop, and the one who sows a generous amount of seeds will also reap a generous crop.

YEveryone should give whatever they have decided in their heart. They shouldn't give with hesitation or because of pressure. God loves a cheerful giver.

These verses were the reason for the decision not to use Commitment/Pledge Cards at our Commitment Sunday worship services this year. Another reason was to honor you for your historical record of meeting the financial needs of our ministries for the past several years.

The **2019 Budget Year** will soon be closed. Before we finish our Christmas celebrations, **2020** will be here. Your offering envelopes for 2020 will be available in November 2019. Please continue, or increase, your generous contributions into the New Year.

To reduce the number of checks you write, try our Electronic Funds Transfer. On your computer or phone, go to <a href="www.lpcumc.org">www.lpcumc.org</a> and select online giving. You'll see an explanation of Electronic Giving, a list of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) and the answers. Click on the **Donate Now** button to set up your electronic regular and/or special giving.

Lastly, if you are over 70 ½ years old

and must take a **Required Minimum Distribution** (RMD) from your traditional IRA, you can get a tax break. You may use a Qualified Charitable **Distribution** (QCD) to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified charity such as Lincoln Park Community UMC. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your RMD requirement plus reduces the taxable amount of your IRA distribution. This will lower both your adjusted gross income and taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability. It also helps with your contributions to LPCUMC during 2020. You will soon be receiving your giving statement for the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2019, year to date. Please check to see that it agrees with your personal record of giving. If not, contact the church office

On my morning jog, I often see the same people: folks heading to work, taking their kids to school, walking their

dogs, or going for a run.
Mostly, I don't know their
names, just recognize their
faces. Sometimes they or I
say something in passing.
Morning....Beautiful
day ....How ya doing? But, I
was stumped by the comment
one fellow made as he walked

by: Six years, and it's finally gone."

Great, I said, perfectly clueless. What is he talking about? But after I passed him, it became clear. That was the guy who used to walk with a cane. He always had a very jaunty walk, confident, a sure step in his business suit, and I'd wondered about the cane. He hardly used it. I guess I'd mentioned in passing, You're walking well, or something like that. And now he just told me he didn't need the cane anymore.

There was so much I didn't know. The years of physical therapy, the accident or illness that led to the cane, the reason for

his improvement-- it was all a mystery. But he wanted to share the good news with me.

When Jesus healed the lame and made the blind see, He often told them not to share the good news— advice they mostly ignored or found diffi-

cult to follow. And for good reason. When your life has been turned around, you want to celebrate. It can be a moment of praise and thanksgiving.

Next time I passed the man I told him, *Congratulations!* Thanksgiving grows when it's shared, even with perfect strangers on a morning jog.

Help me, Lord, to see Your good news and celebrate wherever it's seen.
