# A New Idea for Families this Fall: Family Mini-Retreats

Unfortunately, we will not offer a Vacation Bible School this summer. I tried to find an "open" time that would work — inbetween sports and vacations, but it didn't work. So we'll

re-group next summer as "life-after-Covid" brings a return to more normalcy. And I'll publish the dates of VBS 2022, far in advance.

However, Pastor Kurien and I spoke about an alternative to VBS, and we

developed an idea to offer three Sunday (2-hour long) family mini-retreats in the fall. They'll include lunch or dinner, activities, and worship experiences for both parents and their children.

I'll ask the Education Committee to help develop a program for these Sundays. In the past 18 months we've had so little time for our families and their children to be together. Pastor Kurien and I hope that these mini-retreats will rekindle a desire to be together with our church family. Additionally, we'll invite other families, so if you know of a family we should contact, please let us know. Please mark your calendars for these three fall Sundays: *October 3, 24,* and *November 7.*


Now when David had served God's purpose in his own generation, he fell asleep; he was buried with his ancestors and his body decayed.

Acts 13:36 (NIV)
