her position at Lincoln Park, as of December 31, 2021. She was not actively seeking another position but was contacted by parishioners at St Benedict's Roman Catholic Church. After thoughtful consideration and prayer, she felt God calling her to serve another church family.

We're deeply saddened to see Bev leaving after a 16-year ministry here, and we're immeasurably grateful for all she's given us in Christ's service. She has left a legacy of excellence and has prepared

those around her to carry on at that same high level. She has also left us many wonderful memories...cantatas, summer youth musicals, VBS, mini-concerts, innumerable children's programs,

and even our inaugural Halloween trunk-or-treat which she spear-headed.

The truth is that **Beverly Perella** is much more than a Music Director... she is, and always will be, a teacher. Perhaps her lesson to us now is that when you hear God calling you in a new direction, you are wise to listen carefully.

Bev, you may no longer be our Music Director, but you will always be part of our Lincoln Park family.

steps to mitigate the spread of the virus and reduce the exposure of our members who choose to attend church. The following guidelines were developed:

- Starting Sunday, January 9, church windows will be opened slightly to allow fresh air ventilation, and the fan will circulate air, so the church may not be as warm as it usually is. Attendees may want to dress warmer than they usually do.
- The outdoor sign will reflect that **masks are now required**; ushers will have them available at the door for those without masks.
- We also suggest that anyone not vaccinated should seriously consider attending the virtual service rather than physically attending church.
- Singing will be reduced, and people will be asked to sing to themselves when hymns are played.
- And, as we've done previously, social distancing will be followed with regard to seating in the church.



With the recent passing of **Archbishop Desmond Tutu**, **Donna** and **Darwin Stapleton** were reminded of seeing and worshipping with him in 2016. *I don't*



know if it was the Holy Spirit or serendipity, says Donna. Darwin adds, Let's say, "We seized the opportunity." Both agree that all things worked (miraculously?) together to see them to this awesome meeting.

Although they had moved to Pennsylvania, some members of their Cleveland church (one of whom was from South Africa) invited them on a group trip there in 2016. The Stapletons, who gleefully accepted the invitation, went ahead of the group for a few days on their own in Cape Town.

While Donna was browsing through books of Tutu's in a thrift shop, a woman approached her and asked, *Would you like to meet Desmond?* She explained that the Archbishop would be doing Matins (morning worship) in his church down the street and arranged for them to be included!

When they arrived the next morning at 7 am, they were seated in a big square, set up near the altar, with 40-50 other worshippers. Archbishop Tutu asked them all to give their names and countries of origin. They were people from all over the world, says Donna. We passed the peace and were invited to walk around and talk to each other. He wanted to know who we are. He wanted us to relate to each other. They received Communion from Tutu himself, He dipped the wafer and put it on our tongues, she says. When the service was over, he signed books for person after person carefully, making sure of the spelling of names.

Darwin says he and Donna originally met as social workers in Philadelphia many years ago and were committed to social justice. He'd always admired Tutu for his devotion to non-violence, gentleness, and pacifism. To meet Desmond Tutu, in his cloak of gentleness and humility, Darwin says was a moving experience.

Darwin's favorite quote from **Archbishop Desmond Tutu**:

"Do your little bit of good where you are; it's those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world."
