Pastor Chris, whose career spanned two continents, began his ministry in the

Church of South India where he served as a Diocesan Youth Organizing Secretary and Director of Missions. He was also on the teaching staff at the United Theologi-



cal College in Bangalore, India. After moving to the states in the late 1990's, he took the position of Lead Chaplain resident at Southwest Memorial Hospital, Houston TX.

With the encouragement of **Bishop George W. Bashore**, a former Reading pastor, and Spring Township resident, Chris accepted an appointment in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference at St. Matthew's Church, Reading, in 2001. Four years later **Bishop Marcus Matthews** appointed Chris as a District Superintendent, and he served five years as Dean of the Cabinet. After six years as a DS, he was appointed Director of Connectional Ministries until 2017, when he returned to the pulpit at First Church in Lansdale.

"I was humbled to be endorsed as an episcopal candidate twice by the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference," Chris said. While an elder in our Conference, he also served on numerous boards of our Annual, Jurisdictional, and General Conferences and on the World Methodist Council.

Next month he completes four years

here at Lincoln Park and his full-time ministry.

"I will continue in service as an assisting Elder in the Annual Conference, as a member on the World Methodist Council, Methodist Hospital Foundation Board, the Northeast Jurisdictional Program Committee, and on various Conference Boards and

Agencies," Chris added.

While Chris plans to stay active in the church, much of his time will be spent with his wife of 37 years, Christy Jacob, who plans to continue working as a math teacher at Reading HS and visiting his three daughters:

- **Dr Elsen Chris Jacob**, an Assistant professor, St. John's University, NY, is married to **Dr. Manu Ben Johny**, Assistant Professor and research lab director, Columbia University, New York. They have a daughter, Shiloh Grace, who is seven months old.
- Dr Susan Chris Jacob, Clinical Manager, Beth Israel Lahey Health System, Boston is married to Dr. Alexis Hubaud, Senior Scientist, Be Biopharma, Boston.
- And the Rev Ann Chris Jacob, a Co-pastor at Edmonds UMC, Seattle. Ann is one of the two members from the United Methodist Church presently serving the World Council of Churches and the Central Committee of the WCC.


LP Church Considers Daycare In Partnership with YMCA

ABIDE ... This Christian Meditation

App provides a short audio devotional daily; it's Bible -based and right there on your iPhone. There are bedtime stories to help you sleep and, if you're feeling desperate (it happens), you can choose a topic like *Depression*, *Healing*, *Grief*, *Forgiveness*, and be di-

rected to specific meditations. I have been using this app for years now, and it doesn't disappoint.

This past year *Abide* was acquired by *Guideposts*. There may be a free trial period, and I can share a particular meditation with you if you want to try it. I pay \$40 a year for it, and—believe me—it's well worth it. You can also purchase a gift subscription.

SIGHT AND SOUND THEATRE in

Lancaster produces Bible stories in grand productions. We saw *David* last fall for the first time with our 10 year-old granddaughter, Isla. This spectacular rendering of David's story is stunning for all. Goliath was there along with many live animals—(horses,
