Order My Steps in Your Word, Dear Lord

The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord, and He delights in his way. Though he falls, he shall not be utterly cast down; for the Lord upholds him with His hand. I have been young, and now am old; yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his descendants begging bread."—Psalm 37:23–25

KING DAVID—a shepherd, musician, soldier, and King of Israel—composed Psalm 37. There he speaks of evildoers and how they may thrive for a time, but. ultimately, God's justice prevails. He also reflects on the blessings of being reverent and faithful to God. In verses 23–25, David highlights key truths:

God directs and guides the path of those who seek Him.
God is in control of that path.
When a faithful follower stumbles
God is there to catch them.
Throughout David's lifetime, he has witnessed God's provision for the Righteous and their descendants.

Earlier this week, while listening to music on Pandora, I heard a gospel song by the Brooklyn Tabernacle Choir entitled *Order My Steps in Your Word, Dear Lord.* The song was written in 1991 by African American composer Glenn Edward Burleigh. He beautifully captures the essence of Psalm 37 in his lyrics. The writer pleads with God to direct every part of his life—his thoughts, actions,



and interactions with others. Every follower of Christ should desire such a faithful walk with God. The song emphasizes the importance of asking God to align our steps with His Word.

In today's world, many seek to bend God's Word to fit their desires, rather than aligning their lives with it. However, as believers, we can remain faithful by remembering God's love, following Christ's example of humility, and reflecting on the Word of God.

If you get the opportunity to listen to *Order My Steps in Your Word, Dear Lord*, I encourage you to do so. In the meantime, as you go about your daily lives—traveling, visiting family, or interacting with co-workers—consider these lyrics:

Lead me, guide me every day Send Your anointing, Father, I pray Order my steps in Your Word, YES, Order my steps in Your Word.

Answer: LP's 80th Anniversary

Eighty years ago this September 23, church-minded residents of Lincoln Park gathered in an old school house and held its first organized church service. They decided on the name Lincoln Park Community Church and planned to be affili-

ated with the United Brethren Church. Less than a year later, our church was officially designated a missionary church of the Evangelical United Brethren Church. In 1968 the EUB churches merged with the Methodist denomination, and we became part of the United Methodist Church.

Fast forward, we're now 80 years young and it's time to celebrate. We say "young" because Berks County has many churches dating back to the 1700's.

At the time of our 75th anniversary, Covid was in high gear, and we were limited in our activities. Pastor Ouentin feels it's time to celebrate our church heritage and the rebirth of a vibrant, growing congregation. Council agreed, and the Anniversary Committee was formed. They met at the end of March and came up with ideas to celebrate outside of Sunday morning worship.

At the top of the priority list is having a new pictorial directory printed of our

membership and church activities. Please, check out the details and dates for sign up to get your family portraits taken. We need your participation and help to make this project a real success.

When **Parker Chadwick** started as our Children and Youth Education Coordinator in late April, his life seems to have come full circle. His parents, **Bill** and **Becky Chadwick**, moved to Berks County in the late '90's, and soon they were active LP Church

members. Parker began attending Sunday School as a toddler and remained active in youth programs here until graduating from Wilson. In senior high, he helped **Dorris McCoy**, our

Director of Christian Education, working with the younger children.

During Parker's senior year, Bill took a Professor of Archaeology position at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Becky, (who'd been our Worship Leader at the time) moved the rest of the family to Indiana PA; she became Christian Education Director there at a large Presbyterian church.

Parker enrolled at IUP with a dual major: Archaeology & Anthropology and Religious Studies. After graduation in 2022, he worked for two archaeological firms in Tennessee, North Carolina, and

New Jersey, (where he unfortunately sustained a knee injury that put him on workmen's compensation.) At that time he decided to go into Education.

Last spring Parker took a position as a Social Studies teacher at the Janus

School in Mount Joy, Lancaster County. I asked him, *But why here in eastern PA?*

I wanted to come back home, he said. But your family is in Indiana, Pennsylvania, I said. But my

church family is here, Parker added.

Then one afternoon a month ago, while cutting through Lincoln Park on his way to Wyomissing, he spotted the *Help Wanted* ad on our electronic sign. We're not sure if he ever made it to Wyomissing that afternoon, because at the top of the hill he turned onto Wellington Avenue where Dorris lives. The rest is history.

He currently lives in Ephrata, and is engaged to **Laura Broughton**, of Harrisburg, whom he met at IUP.
